1 Introduction

The Capital Facilities Element is a requirement of the Growth Management Act to attempt to ensure the coordination of the County's physical capital facilities planning with sound fiscal planning. The requirements of this element are:

- An inventory of existing capital facilities/public facilities/public services.
- A forecast of the future needs for capital facilities/public facilities/public services.
- Proposed locations and sizes or capacities of expanded or new capital facilities/public facilities/public services.
- At least a six-year plan that will finance capital facilities/public facilities/public services
- A requirement to reassess the land use element of the Stevens County Comprehensive Plan if funding falls short of meeting existing needs and to ensure that the land use element, capital facilities plan element, and financing plan within the capital facilities plan element are coordinated and consistent.

Previous capital facilities plans have limited inventory and analysis to government-operated facilities. This plan includes many facilities that are privately owned or managed by a special purpose district to paint a more accurate picture of existing and future capital facilities in Stevens County.

2 Definitions

Capital facility: a structure, improvement, or other major assets, including land, fixtures, and related equipment that has a useful life of at least ten years and do not include facilities leased for less than ten years. Capital facilities are provided by or for public purposes and services including, but not limited to the following:

1. Correctional facilities
2. Government offices
3. Roads
4. Recreational facilities
5. Solid waste facilities
6. Utilities
7. Public facilities

The capital facilities listed above include necessary ancillary and support facilities.

Capital improvement: a project to create, expand, or modify a capital facility.

Level of service standards (LOS): quantifiable measures of public services that the County provides to its present and future residents and businesses. They allow the County to assess deficiencies in the services it provides and define minimum threshold standards that should be met by existing and new service facilities to avoid under-served growth.

Public facility: streets, roads, highways, sidewalks, street and road lighting systems, traffic signals, domestic water systems, storm and sanitary sewer systems, parks and recreational facilities, and schools.

Public services: include fire protection and suppression, law enforcement, public health, education, recreation, environmental protection, and other government services.

3 Inventory

This inventory is organized by urban growth area and then by facility type. Non-county facilities are included in this inventory and not separated from county facilities.

Solid Waste Facilities

Stevens County Landfill has seen a major increase in usage over the last ten years, especially the last two years in which record numbers of transactions have gone across the outdated single scale system. Additional self-haul customers along with an increase in commercial trucks has caused major traffic problems, safety concerns, and increased wait times for disposal. The single scale system, receiving area, and the recycling / household hazardous waste area was constructed in 1992 and is no longer adequate to service the needs of a growing county. Additionally, the County took over operations of its South County Transfer Station in 2021 and soon discovered the same problems with the outdated single scale system in place. Lots of hours by the Solid Waste workforce has barely been able to keep traffic off Grouse Creek Road. A record number of self-haul customers at this facility has brought about the same concerns as the landfill. After taking over, the County also discovered that the scale is very close to needing replaced. Improvements at both facilities will decrease wait times for customers, improve functionality, and increase efficiency. Estimated Costs: \$2,000,000.

7 Reassess Land Use

Periodic Reassessment and Assurance of Internal Consistency

During each annual budget process, and not later than December 1 of each year, the Planning Director shall reassess the land use element and other elements of the plan considering the evolving proposed capital facilities plan for that year. If the Planning Director determines the probable funding for capital facilities is at any time insufficient to meet existing needs, the Planning Director shall initiate an expedited public process to be included in the budget hearings, which shall include the reassessment of the land use element, funding possibilities, and levels of service. As a result of such reassessment, appropriate action must be taken to ensure the internal consistency of the land use and capital facilities portions of the plan.

Effect on Pending Applications

Appropriate actions taken by the Board of County Commissioners to ensure internal consistency of the land use and capital facilities portions of the plan due to insufficient funding for capital facilities shall take effect immediately upon passage by the Board and applied to all pending land use applications which have not “vested” as determined by the Prosecuting Attorney’s analysis of then existing land use statutory and case law.

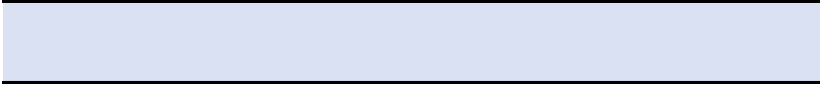
